### Featuring Kathy Morris

"Help, What Do I Do With This Child Now That We Have a Diagnosis?"

This seminar is designed for families of children/adolescents birth-21 years old. An overview of developmental disabilities, including Down Syndrome, Fragile X Syndrome, Cognitive Delays, Autism Spectrum Disorders, and other disabilities will be highlighted. Strategies to support the manifestations of the disabilities will be presented. In addition, an overview of the grief process parents experience will be presented to aid in understanding and to support parents during the early years and beyond the diagnosis.

Kathy Kaluza Morris has been an educator for 45 years specializing in autism and behavior disorders as well as moderate to severe cognitive disabilities. As a speech therapist for students with severe disabilities and as a teacher of students with behavior disorders, including autism and emotional disturbances, she was mentored and supported by many national/international experts from whom she gathered many practical experiences and suggestions which she implemented. Kathy and husband, Guy, "walk the walk and talk the talk" after the birth of their twin sons 32 years ago with autism and cerebral palsy. It has given them perspective of life as parents of children with disabilities as well as of educators.
